







Teaching for Mastery

Free of charge

Variation in questioning to promote deeper understanding

Teachers will develop their understanding of the Teaching for Mastery principle of 'variation', and the impact resources and questioning based around 'variation' can have on promoting deeper understanding in their students.



Run across the academic year, participants will have an opportunity to work collaboratively to understand, co-create materials and then develop practice back in school.

Audience: This is a small-scale project, aimed at schools that are interested in implementing a Teaching for Mastery approach to their mathematics lessons, but who would like to develop some of the basic principles first. Each school should enrol two class based teachers who are passionate about mathematics teaching and have a strong interest in Teaching for Mastery. Both teachers must attend all 5 twilight sessions.
